

Presentation and Examination of the Candidate

The baptismal party gathers at the chancel steps.

Celebrant: The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents and Godparents: I present Jagger Reece Rudd to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Celebrant: Wilt thou on thy part take heed that this child whom thou dost present be brought up in the Christian faith and

life?

Parents and Godparents: I will, by God's help.

Celebrant: Wilt thou by thy prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents: I will, by God's help.

Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the Parents and Godparents:

Celebrant: Dost thou renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer: I renounce them all.

Celebrant: Dost thou renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them all.

Celebrant: Dost thou renounce all sinful desires that draw thee from the love of God?

Answer: I renounce them all.

Celebrant: Dost thou turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as thy Savior?

Answer: I do.

Celebrant: Dost thou put thy whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer: I do.

Celebrant: Dost thou promise to follow and obey him as thy Lord and Master?

Answer: I do.

The Celebrant addresses the congregation:

Celebrant: Will ye who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in his life in Christ?

People: We will.

The Baptismal Covenant (all standing)

Celebrant: Dearly beloved, let us join with Jagger who is now committing himself to Christ Jesus and here renew our own baptismal covenant.

Celebrant: Dost thou believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Celebrant: Dost thou believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

Celebrant: Dost thou believe in God the Holy Ghost?

People: I believe in the Holy Ghost, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Celebrant: Wilt thou continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People: I will, by God's help.

Celebrant: Wilt thou persevere in resisting evil. and, whenever thou dost fall into sin, repent and return unto the Lord?

People: I will, by God's help.

Celebrant: Wilt thou proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ Jesus?

People: I will, by God's help.

Celebrant: Wilt thou seek and serve Christ in all people, loving thy neighbor as thyself?

People: I will, by God's help.

Celebrant: Wilt thou strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every person?

People: I will, by God's help.

Celebrant: Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ thy Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory: who liveth and reigneth now and for ever. Amen. The altar party and the baptismal party proceed to the baptismal font.

Thanksgiving over the Water

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: And with thy spirit.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People: It is meet and right so to do.

Celebrant: We give thee thanks, Almighty God, for the gift of water, over which thy Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation; through which thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise; in which thy Son Jesus Christ received the baptism of John and the anointing of the Holy Spirit, being manifested thereby as the Messiah, the Christ, who leadeth us, through his precious death and mighty resurrection, from the bondage of sin unto life everlasting.

We give thee thanks, O Father, for the water of Baptism, in which we are buried with Christ in his death; by which we partake of his resurrection; through which we are made regenerate of the Holy Spirit. Celebrant (to the parents and godparents): Name this child.

Celebrant: Jagger Reece, thou art sealed by the Holy Ghost in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

Celebrant: Receive the light of Christ, so that when the bridegroom comes thou mayest go forth with all the saints to meet him; and see that thou dost keep the grace of thy Baptism. Amen.

Celebrant: Let us pray: We most heartily thank thee, O heavenly Father, that by water and the Holy Spirit thou hast bestowed upon this thy servant the forgiveness of sin, and hast raised him unto the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in thy Holy Spirit. Give unto him inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love thee, and the gift of joy and wonder in all thy works. Amen.

Celebrant: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All: We receive you into the household of God: Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The altar party and the baptismal party proceed to the chancel steps as the Celebrant sprinkles the people with water.
