


sion credits: Another World, Ryan's Hope, and The 1988 Kennedy Center Awards.



ABOUT THE PLAY . . .

My One and Only opened on Broadway in 1983, but its roots go back to 1927 and the Gershwin musical Funny Face. There was also a 1957 film version of Funny Face which starred Audrey Hepburn and Fred Astaire.

While Funny Face was the basis for the story line, originally adapted by Peter Stone and Timothy Mayer, the show you are about to see also contains Gershwin tunes from Rosalie, Strike Up The Band, Tell Me More, Treasure Girl, Delicious, Damsel In Distress, Tip-Toes, A Dangerous Maid and Goldwyn Follies of 1938.

My One and Only went through more than its share of pre-Broadway turmoil. Both Mayer and the show's original director, Peter Sellars departed the show during its Boston tryout. The staging and choreography was taken over by its star Tommy Tune and collaborator Thommie Walsh. Tune enlisted no less talents than Mike Nichols and Michael Bennett to help rework the script.

Tommy Tune and former model, Twiggy, brought the show to Broadway amid significant critical and public acclaim.

ALLENBERRY PLAYHOUSE STAFF

MICHAEL HANEY (Artistic Director) As the new Artistic Director of Allenberry Playhouse Michael staged this seasons opener Barefoot In The Park and They're Playing Our Song. He directed Nunsense and The Sound of Music last season and has appeared as Henry Higgins in My Fair Lady, Jerry in Two For The Seesaw with his wife Amy Warner, and as Boolie in Driving Miss Daisy. A native of Kansas City, Missouri, Michael began his career in Washington, D.C. After graduating from Catholic University he acted for two seasons with the Arena Stage including their tour of the Soviet Union in Our Town and Inherit The Wind. He appeared on Broadway in Zalman by Elie Wiesel. Off-Broadway in Return To The River, The Devils, and Jail Diary of Albee Sachs. He performed regionally for Missouri Repertory Theatre, Great Lakes Shakespeare Festival and Center Stage in Baltimore. He toured in Nicholas Nickleby playing fourteen different roles. He has directed Savage In Limbo for the Colony Theatre in NY, Our Town for the Hutchinson Family Theatre and new works for The Loaves and Fish Theatre, The Passage Theatre and Playwrights Theatre of New Jersey. He has directed and developed dozens of one person shows for Affiliate Artists in New York and directed his wife's Oregon Trail play As The Wind Rocks The Wagon at the Edinburgh Festival, Scotland, and in venues across the U.S.

RICHARD J. FROST (Production Stage Manager) Founding Director for Allenberry Resort's Murder Mystery Weekends, this season marks Mr. Frosts 16th season with the Playhouse. As a member of the Society of Stage Directors & Choreographers his directing credits include Painting Churches, Intimate Exchanges, Black Coffee, They're Playing Our Song, South Pacific and Sleuth. Regional credits include two seasons with Kenley Players in Ohio where he worked with Tony Randall and Jack Klugman in The Odd Couple, Burt Reynolds in The Rainmaker and staged the entire tea bag scene for Phyliss Diller in Everybody Loves Opal. As Allenberry's Resident Production Stage Manager & Lighting Designer his familiar call of "Places Please" can be heard through the pines. He is pleased to be a part of the directing trio Rothhaar, Haney & Frost.

CATE VAN WICKLER (Business Manager/Production Coordinator) is not new to Allenberry having served in the capacity of technical director and stage manager over the last 16 years. She works daily with our E.M.C. staff as well as the directors and various designers on budget and work schedules as well as rehearsals, transportation and housing. During Allenberry's off-season, Cate has worked at the Folger Library Theatre, the Hayloft Dinner Theatre and Ford's Theatre in Washington, D.C. as technical director and stage manager.
