ABOUT THE PLAY

Set in 19th-century Germany, *The Student Prince* is a timeless classic story of romance, gallantry, and adventure. The handsome Prince Karl Franz of Karlsberg journeys to the University of Heidelberg, accompanied by members of the royal court, to complete his education before ascending the throne. Upon arriving at the Three Golden Apples Inn, the prince and his court are warlmy greeted by the owner and a crowd of students with cheer and chants of drinking. While in this exciting town, he encounters his true love, Kathie, the barmaid at the Inn. Love at first sight leads to the perfect romance, as they profess their love for one another through the beatiful lyrics of "Deep in My Heart."

However, an unexpected visit from the Prime Minister, Von Mark, foils the prince's plans to run away with Kathie forever. The king's illness calls the prince home where the path of duty - and the beautiful Princess Margaret whom he is expected to marry - await him. Reluctant to give up his freedom and return to his orderly palace, the prince must evaluate his loyalties.

KRISTIN CARBONE (Kathie)

Kristin, a Massachusetts native, recently graduated from Carnegie Mellon University with a BFA in Vocal Performance and a BA in Anthropology.
