

# The Depot Theatre History

The Depot Theatre was founded by Carol Buchanan in 1979 as a project of the Westport Historical Society which saw the potential for cultural activity in the then newly renovated town-owned 19th century train depot over which the WHS maintained stewardship. To help finance the professionally staffed, community oriented theatre project, the Historical Society turned to a unique solution: Wednesday Night Bingo. Indeed, without the Historical Society and the proceeds from weekly bingo, the Depot Theatre would just be an idea.

Relying heavily on the talents of regional thespians and volunteers, the Depot Theatre tenaciously made its way through one season after another. Each year marked an improvement in the quality of the programs, a greater ambition on the part of the company and an increase in the numbers of people enjoying the Depot's special brand of theatre magic. The dream to establish a professional theatre company in this rural area continued to be nurtured and was finally realized in 1988 when the Depot Theatre entered into an agreement with the Actors' Equity Association.

In addition to the mainstage productions, the Depot also supports both Apprentice and Intern Programs for regional youth, various Arts-in-Education activities, and a Gallery Program featuring area artists and craftspeople.

Throughout its history, the Depot Theatre's Artistic vision has been to enhance the cultural climate of the North Country through the presentation of professional productions which challenge the audience to participate in the creative energy and immediacy of live theatre. Here, the production emphasis has been on the vision and intent of the playwright and the collaborative relationship between the Theatre artists, which gives that vision form, style, and a sense of passion. It is through that collaborative relationship between the artists and, by extension, with the audience that the Depot Theatre has come to be known as a good place to work and a home for exciting theatre.







## ABOUT THE CREATORS...

GEORGE ABBOTT (Author) Few, if any, in modern American theatre are as recognized for such long-standing and prolific contribution as George Abbott. Over eighty years, he produced, directed, and wrote more than one hundred twenty shows, winning an astounding forty Tony Awards in sixteen years (1948-1962).

Mr. Abbott was born on June 25, 1887. He graduated from the University of Rochester in 1911, went to Harvard, and studied playwriting under George Pierce Baker. Mr. Abbott went on to become the "Dean of Broadway Showmen," collaborating as producer, director, and playwright in such hits as On Your Toes, The Boys from Syracuse, Pal Joey, On the Town, Where's Charley?, Call Me Madam, A Tree Grows in Brooklyn, The Pajama Game, Damn Yankees, and A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum. His play Fiorello! won the 1959 Pulitzer Prize. In 1976, he was presented with a special Lifetime Achievement Award for his outstanding and continuous contribution to the American Theatre.

At age one hundred, he directed the revival of *On Your Toes* and, shortly before his death, assisted in the revival of *Damn Yankees*.

He died on January 31, 1995, at the age of one hundred seven.

RICHARD ADLER (Lyricist/Composer) was born to eminent concert pianist Clarence Adler and Elsa Richard Adler in 1921 in New York. He attended the University of North Carolina, where he studied under Paul Green and graduated in enough time to serve as a naval officer in World War II. After the war, he wrote jingles for the Celanese Corporation and later quit to devote himself to songwriting.

In the summer of 1950, he met Jerry Ross—a unique collaboration in the respect that they both wrote lyrics and composed music. They attracted the attention of Frank Loesser and became his promising young apprentices.

Together, Mr. Adler and Mr. Ross started out writing songs for radio and television shows and composing material for Jimmy Durante, Marlene Dietrich, and Eddie Fisher. Their finest work was featured in *The Pajama Game* (1954) and *Damn Yankees* (1955), earning them two Tony Awards and offers for even more shows. Tragedy cut short their moment in the sun with the untimely death of Mr. Ross in November 1955 from a tuberculosis-related illness.

After Mr. Ross' death, he wrote music and lyrics for Little Women, The Gift of the Magi, Kwamina, and A Mother's Kisses. He also composed the orchestral works Retrospectum, Yellowstone Overture, Wilderness Suite, and The Lady Remembers, the Statue of Liberty Suite, all of which were nominated for the Pulitzer Prize.

Adler became known as the unofficial talent coordinator for the White House during the Kennedy and Johnson Administrations, organizing, among others, Marilyn Monroe's famous "Happy Birthday" to JFK and the Democratic National Committee's fund raisers.

His autobiography, You Gotta Have Heart, was published in 1990.

RICHARD BISSELL (Author) was born on June 27, 1913, in Dubuque, Iowa. He studied anthropology at Harvard, and graduated in 1936. After leaving Harvard, he went to work on riverboats on the Mississippi, Ohio, and Monongahela Rivers.

In 1945, his family convinced him to return to Iowa and work as a supervisor at the family's pajama factory, the H.B. Glover Company. This experience provided for him the creative thought fodder for the novel 7½ Cents (British title: A Gross of Pyjamas), his first popular novel. He moved to Connecticut (yet remained on the Board of Directors for the H.B. Glover plant) and assisted George Abbott in the theatrical adaptations of story: The Pajama Game. His next novel, Say, Darling (1957), was a thinly-disguised fictional memoir about a mid-western author whose novel's success brings him to Broadway. Ironically, it was later adapted into a musical. Other works include Goodbye, Ava (1960), You Can Always Tell a Harvard Man (1962), My Life on the Mississippi, or Why I Am Not Mark Twain (1973), and 1776—And All That (1975).

He died in Dubuque, Iowa, on May 4, 1977.

JERRY ROSS (Lyricist/Composer) was born Jerold Rosenberg on March 9, 1926, in the East Bronx. At age thirteen, he was known as the "Boy Star" of Yiddish stage and film. He came to focus his attention on songwriting in his late teens and studied under Rudolph Schramm at New York University.

His first major collaborator was Buddy Kaye, but this ended when, in 1950, he met Richard Adler and began to forge the union that would eventually earn him a Donaldson Award, the Drama Critics Awards, and two Antoinette Perry Awards. Their first shot at Broadway was the musical review John Murray Anderson's Almanac. In May 1954, The Pajama Game premiered in New York, launching them to the height of fame. The following year, Damn Yankees opened, solidifying their future in Broadway and their names in history.

For the greater part of his lifetime, Mr. Ross battled with tuberculosis, which eventually contributed to his death in November 1955, four months shy of his thirtieth birthday. During his life, he had written more than two hundred fifty popular songs.

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE PAJAMA GAME

7½ Cents was a best-selling novel in 1953 when it caught the attention of Robert E. Griffith, Harold S. Prince, and George Abbott, who were all working on Leonard Bernstein's Wonderful Town on Broadway. Collectively, they approached the author, Richard Bissell, to co-write the theatrical adaptation, and they offered the music to Rodgers and Hammerstein, Cole Porter, Jule Styne, and Frank Loesser. None was interested. Mr. Loesser suggested his two young proteges, Richard Adler and Jerry Ross, for the job. Mr. Adler and Mr. Ross eagerly accepted the challenge of writing their first Broadway show, unaware at the time that the show had been previously proposed to the best in the business. Bob Fosse, who was also unknown, signed on to choreograph the show, on the condition that Jerome Robbins would supervise and stage the show in the event that Mr. Fosse could not pull his weight.

The story which Mr. Abbott and Mr. Bissell pulled from the pages of the novel was rather faithful to the original tale; the sole omission was the plot complication in which Sid Sorokin had an affair with a country-club-set girl when it seemed that all was lost with Babe. Mr. Ross and Mr. Adler wrote and re-wrote songs, each day approaching Mr. Abbott with the latest ditty and carefully studying his reaction to see if they had written a hit or a flop. Janis Paige and John Raitt were cast as the two lovers/labor-management rivals, along with vaudevillian and Broadway veteran Eddie Foy, Jr. as Hines and Carol Haney (another unknown) as Gladys.

It was a monumental success. Its world premiere in New Haven completely sold-out, followed by triumphs in Boston, where tickets were selling for as much as \$60 on the black market, and in New York, becoming the eighth longest running musical in its time. It ran from May 13, 1954, through November 24, 1956, for a grand total of 1,061 performances, closing only to remedy a scheduling conflict with a production of *Li'l Abner*. The songs "Hey There" and "Hernando's Hideaway" were so popular that they occupied the Number One and Two spots on the Hit Parade, swapping week after week for the top slot for months.

When the film rights were sold, George Abbott and Stanley Donen directed and cast Doris Day and John Raitt. In 1973, it was revived on Broadway, once again directed by Mr. Abbott.

In May 1998, Richard Adler added Babe's song "If You Win, You Lose" for a production at The Goodspeed Opera House in East Haddam, Connecticut.


