

Play Synopsis

In a small town in California, a disparate group of friends held together by habit gather at the local bar, seeking solace from an increasingly troubled world. Then David, the prodigal friend who left town years ago, returns from New York a new man after 9/11. A manic existentialist, nudist, and lover of life, he is determined to shake his friends out of their stupor and will do whatever it takes to convince them to join him in his newfound lifestyle.

Director's note

This play may make you angry. It may make you sad. It may make you laugh. It may touch your heart. I hope it will do all of those things. This piece is set, as are we all now set, in the world after last September (it still feels like last Tuesday to me). We address topics that surround us in this new world. As an artist, I try to present the varying points of view I find in this brave new world; and present them as clearly as I can. To present one side of any discussion is to present a diatribe. To present two or more sides is to present a dialogue. I hope we have done that, or at least that we can spur discussion. The American flag is something I personally love and respect, if one can be said to love and respect an inanimate object. I suppose I mean that I love and respect the country and people and freedoms it represents. Our country, our people, our freedoms. And, if some characters in this production appear to disrespect the flag, it is done as part of a drama, to spur response, thought and dialogue. Someone once said that, "the best reason not to burn the American flag is because one has the freedom to do so." I will never forget walking up Lexington Avenue from downtown, smoke and ash filling the sky to my back, and seeing a beautiful young girl calling down from her fire escape to a passing friend. She mentioned that she had an American flag and was thinking of displaying it from the fire escape. He agreed with her, she went inside and a moment later, the flag was flying freely from her balcony. It gave me immense comfort. I hope that, whatever you get from this piece, you remember to love one another and be nice. We are only here for a fleeting instant, let us make that instant a joy for

Heather McAllister (Set Design / Asst. Dir) in addition to being Artistic Director of hope theatre, Heather is an actress, director and playwright. Kelly McAllister (Author/Sound Design) as a writer, this is Kelly's first full-length play. He previously wrote the libretto for a musical version of The Snow Queen for Children's Theater Workshop in CA, and has had excerpts from his first novel, "The Aviary" published in (t)here magazine. Aside from writing he is also an actor. Favorite roles include: the title character from last year's Edward III, Cassius in Julius Caesar for Shakespeare in the Park(ing Lot), Adam/Aron in East of Eden at the Western Stage, Last Call was first done as a one act at Turnip Theatre as part of a new play series. Thanks must go to Jack Halpin for suggesting Kelly should submit Last Call for the Fringe. Thanks also to Nicole, for keeping me balanced. Kelly dedicates this show to all his fellow wolves, especially DanO, who long ago told Kelly "it's biting cold."
