

The Status of Central Illinois Water Resources

A public seminar series sponsored by First Presbyterian Church of Urbana Sundays, April 28 and May 5 at 10:45 a.m. in the Chapel

Historically, Central Illinois has enjoyed a safe and plentiful supply of water which met the needs of households, agriculture and industry. But what is the status of this vital resource today?

Sunday, April 28 Impacts of Climate Change on Water Resources in Central Illinois

Dr. Jim Angel, an employee of the Illinois State Water Survey from 1984 to 2018 and the State Climatologist from 1996 to 2018, will discuss the impact of climate change on water supplies available to Central Illinois homeowners, agriculture and industry.

Mapping Aquifers from the AIR: A New Way to Study the Mahomet Aquifer, the Major Source of Drinking Water in Much of Central Illinois

Dr. Kisa Mwakanyamale-Gilkie, Associate Research Scientist and Geophysicist at the Illinois State Geological Survey and lead investigator for the Mahomet Aquifer Airborne Mapping Program will describe improved techniques for mapping and understanding aquifers like the Mahomet Aquifer, the major source of drinking water for Champaign-Urbana and many other municipalities.
